Writing requires a skill. Regarding the narrative style, the narration includes proper implementation of a beginning, arrangement, progress and a definite ending. Narrative style identifies who is telling the story, that is, through whose eyes the readers see the action. It also consists of the person's point of view (first, second or third person). Ernest Hemingway's *The Sun Also Rises* is an example for first person point of view where the readers feel like directly hearing the dialogue from the characters. *Bright Lights, Big City* by Jay McInemey stands for second person point of view and the famous novel of Jane Austen's *Pride and Prejudice* stands for the third person point of view narration.

More than the author's knowledge, his skill lies in the presentation of his characters. Aristotle in his *Poetics* says that character and action are the essential elements in the story. Characters can be of mere caricatures, expressing some real or significant persons in a real life or an imaginary one. The main characters and secondary characters should be presented in a way to secure interest. It is important for an author to use subjective or objective method. Objective - in the sense representing a life and character without bias. Subjective – means make up the work with personal tastes, feelings and impressions. Besides, there should be unity of intellect, emotion, imagination and other related qualities.

Every author selects a particular style to show their uniqueness. Writing in a peculiar style requires the proper application of words to their contexts. In the words of Hazlitt,

The proper force of words lies not in the words themselves, but in their application. A word may be a fine – sounding word, of an unusual length, and very imposing from its learning and novelty, and yet in the connection in which it is introduced may be quiet pointless and irrelevant. It is not pomp or pretension, but the adaptation of the expression to the idea that clenches a writer's meaning; as it is not the size or glossiness of the materials, but their being fitted each to its place that gives strength to the arch. (A Book of English Essays.158).

One important key-note of writing style is precision. Unnecessary usage of long words and explanation occupies more space than it is worth. There is no meaning in using rich words and phraseology. It is fully loaded with archaic expressions and obsolete words if an author prefers such a style in his writing. The author should keep the readers in mind while creating his work. It is an art to keep the readers in contact with the book till the end. If there are words and only words and there is no substantial matter then the style is gaudy. Words without meaning are like life without soul. Applying dialogue format, slang and clichés, literary terms and even punctuations enhance the writers' image.

The style of writing differs from a writer to writer. We can observe that writers from centuries flourished very well in literature because of their writing style. Philip Roth is similar to Galsworthy. The basic characteristic feature of Roth's plays is that each of them deals with a social concern. He saw the society with its unjust laws and powerful institutions, its distinction of wealth and power, crushed down a large number of poor and helpless individuals. Some of his novels like *Goodbye Columbus, Everyman, The Human Stain* deals with a problem that an individual faces in his everyday life.

The foremost thing, readers notice in reading the plays, is the evident sincerity of the writer. The writer's desire is to maintain artistic integrity of soul. Likewise, Roth being such an author who sets down without fear favour or prejudice the problem and leaves the public to draw the moral in any way independently. He tries to remain strictly impartial in his presentation like Galsworthy. Galsworthy himself says "Let me try to eliminate any bias, and see the whole thing as one should, purged of all the prejudices, passion and predilections of mankind" (The Balance Sheet of the Soldier – Workman. 842)
